Two Durban High School Grade 11 Rugby Players, Lwandile Menze and Celimpilo Gumede, have been invited by the South African Rugby Union to attend The Elite Player Development Phase 2 - U17 Assessment Camp, which will be held at Hugenote High School in Wellington from 1 to 6 October, 2017.

This training camp is part of a high performance programme for promising schoolboy players who have been identified by selectors as players who show signs of early promise. The players are given advice on vital components such as conditioning, correct training and mental skills programmes.

Lwandile Menze (17), who hails from the Eastern Cape, plays for the DHS 1st XV Rugby. Lwandile was also a member of the KZN Craven Week Team this year.

Celimpilo Gumede (17) from Mtubatuba also plays for the DHS 1st XV Rugby. Last year, he attended the SARU U16 Assessment Camp in Paarl and this year he was selected for the SA Schools U19 Rugby Team. Celimpilo also played for KZN Sharks at Craven Week Team this year.

Sport Results

SOCCER vs WESTVILLE

In less than a minute from the start of the match, and to the delight of the DHS supporters, the DHS midfield kept the ball and advanced towards the Westville goal. A piercing through-ball found striker Lindokhule Mthimkhulu who picked up the ball and with his second touch buried it with a clean strike into the back of the Westville net.

DHS kept the lead until the 20th minute despite having a penalty shout against them turned down by the referee who yellow carded the Westville striker for diving.

In the 24th minute Westville equalised through a long attacking throw from the touchline which found its way to striker Jordan Schwartz, who tapped in at the back post for an easy finish.

Jordan then converted a spot kick for his second goal of the game in the 27th minute when midfielder Ryan Wray made a penetrating run into the DHS box before being tripped.

DHS missed an opportunity to equalise 5 minutes later when they were awarded a penalty after Mthimkhulu was brought down in the 18 area.

Blake Elliot, the DHS captain, stepped up to take the penalty but it was easily saved by the Westville keeper Darren Koepke who picked his spot and went left making the right choice.

Westville's third goal in the 51st minute came when Schwartz again picked up a pass from midfield, took a touch and calmly slotted the ball past DHS goalkeeper Tiagen Terblanche into the bottom left corner of the net.

It was a disappointing end to the season and a game which DHS were desperate to win after losing to rivals College the week before

in the Raw Cup challenge match. However, Westville were worthy winners and proved that good organisation amongst the players pays off most of the time.

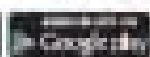
