### **Grade 8 Leadership Camp**

The DHS Leadership Team and prefects hosted our annual Grade 8 Leadership and Orientation Course from Friday, 12 January 2018 to Sunday, 14 January 2018. The purpose of the three day course was to provide the Grade 8s with an opportunity to participate in an outdoor experience.

The well-structured course presented by trained facilitators from The Venture Group (Eduventures) placed an emphasis on group dynamics, personal growth, leadership theory, and an introduction to all aspects of life as a Durban High School learner.

The boys arrived at school on the morning of 12 January, and it was apparent from the start that many moms had done the packing. Big suitcases and oversized tents were the order of the day and it was very clear that many hadn't grasped the required minimalism outlined in the kit lit. This aside, there were many boys well arrived very prepared, even though they were sharing resources. This bodes well for the future outdoor leadership activities that they will be embarking on in the future. One difference from previous years was the fact that the camp was to be held at a secret location. The aim of this was to add to the surprise and excitement factor.

Once registration had been completed all and documentation checked the boys were put onto buses and taken to DLI. I would like to thank those parents who completed all the necessary documentation before departure as this made my job so much easier.

On arrival the boys had to hike around the race course with their kit. This activity proved

challenging for the boys with excessive kit but got the group working as a team with boys helping each other even though they had only just met.

On arrival at the base the boys were welcomed again by their facilitators and prefects and split up into random groups and they had to complete a few ice-breaker challenges. This forced the boys to make new friends very quickly. I was impressed by the competiveness of the groups and new that the weekend's activities were going to be a success.

After the ice-breakers the boys set up camp and again some realised the need to check their packing and equipment. number of the tents were missing essential components and again the boys were forced to make a plan as a team and learn to check their own equipment before leaving home. For many this was the first time that they had erected a tent without the help of a parent or older sibling and the facilitators and prefects had their work cut out guiding the young campers.

After this the groups worked through rotations that included the following:

Climbing wall, Group Dynamics, Archery, Go Kart Building, Compass based Orienteering and Treasure Hunt, and Courageous Challenge (this allowed the boys to walk around the entire racecourse with various activities along way). All activities really got the boys working as a team with some proving more challenging than others. These tasks were spread over the two and a half days and were interspersed with group sessions focussing on life as a DHS learner.
