Nonpareil Academy

The Nonpareil Academy has begun 2018 with a great deal of activity, learning and understanding of the modern approach of 'autonomous learning'.

This style of learning is more experiential and requires a type of learner to 'manage' his learning style. A facilitator and learner engage with the main concepts rather than the standard teacher only approach. This entails research to be done by the learners on their laptops in their own time enabling accelerated learning those that show initiative and creativity advance their knowledge.

This Academy covers two assessment programmes. The Cambridge International Assessment is offered as well as an Extension of the Education

Department's syllabus. Both these programmes run simultaneously with groups broken up into different areas of the venue to either do facilitator, learning with а collaborative learning as group or their own research in cubicles.
