Electives Corner: Ashoka Entrepreneurship

LifeCo UnLtd and Ashoka's ChangeMaker Schools Programme is designed to give budding entrepreneurs opportunity use to thinking entrepreneurial and practice to solve social and environmental problems. The programme is designed to foster empathy, critical and creative thinking, as well as teamwork and (self) leadership skills.

Along with Durban High School, there are three other schools participating in the programme; New Forest High School, Verulam and St Nicholas.

The young entrepreneurs had to complete a Double Your Money Challenge where they tested their ideas by using their own capital and trying to double it by the end of six weeks of trading. Reporting back on lessons learnt earned them a spot at an intensive Opportunity Readiness Bootcamp and ChangeMaker Storytelling weekend away in Karkloof. It was during this that the weekend young entrepreneurs honed their business ideas and models, and their entrepreneurial thinking, through a process of practicing, reflecting and refining.

Those young entrepreneurs who exhibited resilience and passion were then selected to pitch their business ideas to a panel of external experts. The panel

comprised of Aurelia Albert (CEO of Innovate Durban), Selvan Chetty (Superintendent Education of the Billy Nair Circuit, managing 200 Schools in Tongaat, Verulam, Phoenix and Inanda), Lindo Duma (Social Entrepreneur and founder of Iziko Stoves) and Maïté Cluydts (LifeCo UnLtd Manager: Impact Advancement). The panel awarded each group a sum of capital to be invested into their and/or environmental social businesses.

The journey so far has been one of trials and tribulations, but most importantly, the young entrepreneurs are learning to build-up the right mix of resilience, thoughtfulness, critical thinking and confidence to not just fail, but to fail forward.

So Long, Farewell

The final assembly of Term 2 was held on break up day, Friday 22 June. It was a special assembly as we bid farewell to two loyal staff members who, between them, served Durban High School for more than 80 years.

Mrs Marlene Els joined the Finance department in 1985, where she was known for her efficiency and her cool, calm and collected manner. In 2014 she moved across into the Admissions Department which she continued to run with her unruffled resourcefulness. Mrs Els retires after nearly 28 years of dedicated service. Her family flew down from Johannesburg to attend the Assembly. Deputy Head Master, Mr Alan Norton, paid tribute to Mrs Els and she responded, talking directly to the school boys and asking them to make the most of their days at school and to learn all that they can from their teachers.

Living Legend, Mr Tony "AJ" Human, joined the staff of DHS in 1965 at the age of 20. 52 years later, in 2016, he retired from teaching Physical Science and joined The DHS Foundation Trust where has been working with subjects very close to his heart, the DHS Old Boys. Mr Human is retiring from now the Foundation he and was honoured at this, his very last assembly, which was attended by two of his previous Head Masters, a number of Old Boys, some of his personal friends and the Staff and Boys of Durban High School.

Mrs Vermaak, Deputy Principal, paid tribute to Mr Human and his commitment to School, sharing some anecdotes and opinions of the Old Boys, and telling the audience of some of his achievements, including being awarded Freedom of the City London. Mr Human responded, thanking the Staff and Old Boys of DHS for the long road trip which has been such a special part of his life. He said that the Old Boys, who were spread worldwide, are a close knit family, one he intended maintaining his ties with. He made special mention of the very loyal and dedicated Estate Staff and thanked them for all they had done to assist him over the years. Finally, Mr Human wished the Matrics well in their exams and shared a short message with them about respecting others and being responsible for their actions.

The entire School stood and clapped as Mr Human and Mrs Els left the School Hall for the last time.

A special tea was then held in Blackmore House to celebrate their retirement, attended by the staff and visitors. Ms Natalie Rungan, Head of Music, sang a powerful rendition of *Wind Beneath My Wings* in tribute.

Later in the day, farewells were also said to three other staff members who were leaving: Mr van der Merwe is returning to Amanzimtoti, Mr Chetty is immigrating to Ireland and Mrs Gray is returning to live in the UK.

We bid them all farewell and thank them for their contribution to Durban High School.

Saturday's home fixture Kearsney proved to be a spectacle of attacking rugby and one that would delight any neutral supporter! But for the rest of us, it was a heart attack affair as the lead shifted multiple times throughout the game, resulting in a few more grey hairs for the DHS faithful. The game was played in great spirits and epitomised what a healthy schoolboy clash should look like. The final score 41-34 in favour of School.

In true schoolboy fashion DHS raced to a comfortable 15-0 lead, through a superb solo effort from Academy Week scrumhalf, Jaydian Cedares, and another from his KZN compatriot flank, Taarig Kruger. and However, the lead evaporated within a remarkable 15 minutes Kearsney scored unanswered tries to leave the home team stunned and with the major task of having to recover from a 15-26 deficit. It is at these times when you start to see the character and belief in your team. DHS rallied back in true "Horsefly" fashion, just before the break, to score a try, through Academy Week loosehead prop, Marcel Nel, that was all about will and attrition, a sign of a side doing what was necessary to get a foothold back in the game. The half time whistle blew and left the score at 22-26 in favour of Kearsney.

DHS raced out of the half time break, scoring almost within earshot of the whistle as an excellent try by Craven Week centre, Lwandile Menze, took DHS back into the lead. The scores ebbed and flowed for a

while longer before DHS were able (through two excellent tries) to attain a 7-point buffer. The first came through an excellent counter attack try that shifted hands between Academy Week fly-half, Shakur La Douce, and Cedares before the latter finally crossed the line. The captain, Celimpilo Gumede, was able to ensure the lead was enforced as he ran over two players close to the line to score an important try.

With 1 minute remaining, DHS found themselves defending their line for one last effort to ensure victory. The team fought courageously and thwarted the Kearsney advances, ultimately securing their victory and going unbeaten on Van Heerden's in the domestic season.
