From the Head Master's Desk

We are very pleased to be welcoming sport fixtures back at school after a break of over a year. This week has been a hive of activity as we prepare to square up to our oldest traditional rivals on Saturday, Maritzburg College ... the excitement at School has been palpable.

This is an opportune time to share with parents and boys our opinions and beliefs with regards to our boys participating in sport activities.

For a long time, sport has been viewed as a way to stay healthy and in shape, but its importance goes much further. Participating in sport is known to improve the cognitive and memory functions of the brain, helping boys perform better academically and thereby improving their test results.

Furthermore, traits such as discipline, responsibility, self-confidence, accountability, perseverance, and teamwork also play an important part in better academic performance.

Thankfully, studies have shown that by simply playing sports we can reduce stress levels. Physical activity can boost observational skills, improve focus, and even develop our abilities to improvise. Studies have further shown that exercise increases blood flow to the brain and helps the body build more connections between nerves, leading to increased concentration, enhanced memory, stimulated creativity, and better-developed problem solving skills.

In short, playing sports helps your brain grow and makes it work more effectively.

From a social standpoint, sport is a powerful tool that brings people together and creates a sense of community. It develops connections

that bond people together from all walks of life.

The reason supplied by most boys who do not play sports is that they claim they do not have the energy for it, which basically comes down to laziness. However, the belief that the intense exercise of playing sports will leave you exhausted has been proven wrong by research. Exercise pumps more oxygen through your blood and makes your entire system more active, so the benefits of playing sports therefore actually include giving you more energy to accomplish everything else you need to do to manage your busy school schedule.

There is a strong possibility that boys who do not play sport at school are involved in "illicit" activities, most of which parents are unaware of, and they end up flouting with the law before they leave school.

If your son is not playing sport at DHS the question to you as a parent is - Do you really know what he is up to in his spare time? No boy who has played sport at DHS, and who has lived up to the morals and values of School, has failed his Matric year in the recent past!

To sum up, playing school sport has serious benefits. Besides just being fun, sport can help you perform better in school, relax more and worry less, deal with setbacks, work better with others and increase your energy - all of which helps you balance school and everything else going on in your life.

Despite the difficulties of last year, the Class of 2020 managed to produce a fine set of results for our School, with a 98.3% pass rate, a 75% Bachelor Pass rate, 1st ranked Boys school in the Ethusini (City) District and 166 distinctions.

Special congratulations to our top achiever, Thiyashan Pillay (a member of our Nonpareil Academy) who achieved seven distinctions and an aggregate of 91.4%. Thiyashan was our Dux Proxime Accessit (second) at our Speech Day last year.

He was closely followed by Talon Sewnath, who was the Dux at Speech Day. Talon also received seven distinctions, with an aggregate of 90.7%.

Sachen Pather and Muhammad Ghuman both also achieved seven distinctions, with respective averages of 88% and 87%.

For the past few years Neil Lamble and his Durban High School Class of '73 have collected money in order to fund a bursary for a scholar at DHS. This year Neil, who is now semi-retired, decided he would like to do more to support School by assisting to raise funds for the new Astro turf; and he wanted an adventure. After discussions with Andrew Shedlock, the CEO of The DHS Foundation, the Tar-2-Turf Challenge fundraiser was born and the result is that Neil has just finished cycling from Durban to Cape Town, a 1800km trip over 26 days.

Neil left from Top Field at Durban High School on 1 April with a great send off - the Grade 8s formed a 100m long tunnel through which Neil cycled, accompanied by his son Trent, and Taylor Kelly-Stack and Fabian Lazarus of DHS. The DHS band provided background sounds and Head Master Mr AD Pinheiro, Deputy Head Mr Gavin Goodwin, Andrew Shedlock and many friends and family were there to support him.

Michael Baker and Myles Usher of DHS had left earlier that morning, at 4am, to run the first leg of the trip, from Durban to Park Rynie, arriving there just before Neil and Trent, pipping them at the post - a distance of 64.6km.

After 26 days of riding up to 120kms per day, with the occasional rest day, Neil arrived in Cape Town on 26 April, where his friends, family fellow and some Old Boys were waiting to welcome and congratulate him.

Grade 8s Start their DHS Journey

On Tuesday 2 February 2021, the new Grade 8 boys walked through the DHS gate for the first time in their high school career.

Some were very excited to start their journey at our school, and understandably others were a little anxious with the uncertainty of being in a completely new environment. Some of the anxiety also stemmed from the fact that our country and most parts of the world had just eased the Covid-19 pandemic regulations.

The Grade 8 induction programme had to be undertaken differently from previous years in order to ensure that the boys were safe and protected during their stay at school. The boys concluded their two week long induction programme by attending the Bell Ringing Ceremony on 12 February 2021. The Van Heerden rugby field was buzzing with enthusiasm from the newly inducted Grade 8 boys, DHS staff, the Prefects, and the RCL members.

The parents of the boys had the pleasure of witnessing this ceremony via our online platform on DHS-TV as they could not attend the ceremony due to the Covid-19 protocols.

This 155 year old reputable school on the Berea always treats this special occasion with dignity and pride; the boys mark the moment of their arrival by striking the bell; a poignant moment for them all; the Prefects then assist the Grade 8 boys to put on their blazers to signify the start of their journey through this great School. These gestures solidify the ethos of brotherhood between the juniors and the seniors.

Traditionally, Mr Pinheiro (Head Master) and Mr Goodwin (Deputy Head Master) greet the new boys by shaking their hands thus ensuring them that they are indeed part of this great school, however, this year the now familiar nudge of the elbows welcomed them.

May the 2021 Grade 8s' next five years be filled with the joy of fulfilling all their desired high school goals in academics, sports, cultural and leadership potential.
